HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 1

A BILL

for

1 A JOINT RESOLUTION proposing an amendment to the Constitu-
2 tion of the State of Wyoming by amending Article 3, Sec-
3 tions 6 and 7 to provide that bills may be introduced in a
4 budget session by approval of a simple majority rather
5 than a two-thirds vote of either house and to require the
6 legislature to meet for a budget session on the second
7 Tuesday of January in even-numbered years.

8 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WYOMING,
9 two-thirds of all the members of the two houses, voting
10 separately, concurring therein:

11 Section 1. The following amendments to Article 3,
12 Sections 6 and 7, of the Wyoming Constitution are proposed
13 for submission to the electors of the State of Wyoming at
14 the next general election for approval or rejection, to
15 become valid as a part of the constitution if ratified by
16 a majority of the electors. The amendments are as fol-
17 lows:

1 Article 3, Section 6. Compensation of members; dura-
2 tion of sessions.

3 The legislature shall not meet for more than sixty (60)
4 legislative working days excluding Sundays during the term
5 for which members of the house of representatives are
6 elected, except when called into special session. The
7 legislature shall determine by statute the number of days
8 not to exceed sixty (60) legislative working days to be
9 devoted to general and budget session, respectively. The
10 legislature shall meet ~~on~~ IN odd-numbered years for a gen-
11 eral and budget session. The legislature ~~may~~ SHALL meet
12 ~~on~~ IN even-numbered years for budget session. During the
13 budget session no bills except the budget bill may be
14 introduced unless placed on call by a ~~two-thirds~~ MAJORITY
15 vote of either house. The legislature shall meet for no
16 more than forty (40) legislative working days excluding
17 Sundays in any one (1) calendar year, except when called
18 into special session. The compensation of the members of
19 the legislature shall be as provided by law; but no legis-
20 lature shall fix its own compensation.

21 Article 3, Section 7. Time and place of sessions.

22 The legislature shall meet at the seat of government at
23 twelve o'clock noon, on the second Tuesday of January of

1 the odd-numbered years for general and budget session and
2 may SHALL meet on the second Tuesday of January of the
3 even-numbered years for budget session, and at other times
4 when convened by the governor. The governor by procla-
5 mation may also, in times of war or grave emergency by law
6 defined, temporarily convene the legislature at a place or
7 places other than the seat of government.

8 Section 2. The following statement shall be endorsed
9 on the foregoing proposed amendment:

10 The amendment will reduce the vote required for
11 introduction of a bill during a budget session from two-
12 thirds to a majority of either house and will make the
13 convening of the legislature for budget sessions mandatory
14 rather than optional.


