A BILL

for

An Act in relation to garnishment of the State, municipalities, cities,
towns and school district and public officers.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

Section 1. All state, county, city, town and school district officers shall
be liable and subject to garnishment in civil actions on debts hereafter
contracted in the same manner and for the same causes as private individ-
uals now are, or hereafter may be liable and subject to garnishment under
the laws of this State.

Sec. 2. The State of Wyoming, all boards of county commissioners in this
State, all municipalities, cities, towns and school districts shall be liable
and subject to garnishment in civil actions in the same manner and for
the same causes as private individuals now are, or hereafter may be liable
and subject to civil actions under the laws of this State.

Sec. 3. This act, shall take effect and be in force from and after its
passage.
