Thirty-Ninth Session of the STATE LEGISLATURE OF  
THE STATE OF WYOMING

AN ACT creating a commission to study health and safety conditions of industrial employees in the State of Wyoming and to recommend legislation pertaining thereto; defining its composition and duties and providing an appropriation for its expenses.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WYOMING:

Section 1. A commission is hereby created to study health and safety conditions of industrial employees in the State of Wyoming and to recommend legislation pertaining thereto.

Section 2. The commission shall be composed of five (5) members to be appointed by the governor, and the governor shall designate one such member as chairman. Members shall be appointed who are experienced in the fields of health and safety of employees, and both employers and employees shall be represented upon the commission. No more than three (3) members shall belong to the same political party.

Section 3. The commission shall make a complete and thorough study for the purpose of submitting to the governor recommendations for legislation which will insure the maximum protection of the health and safety of industrial employees in the State of Wyoming, consistent with reasonable business practices. Prior to making such recommendations, the commission shall study industrial health and safety legislation in other states having industrial conditions similar to this state; study employee health and safety recommendations made by the National Safety Council and other similar groups concerned with such matters, and by agencies of other states and the federal government; consult with representative groups from

both employers and employees of industry doing business in the State of Wyoming; and take such further steps as it may deem necessary to complete such study. When the commission has determined tentative recommendations, it shall make the same available to the representative groups from employers and employees for their further comments and suggestions.

Section 4. The commission shall upon completion of its study submit in writing to the governor its recommendations for legislation covering the general field of health and safety of industrial employees, including but not limited to procedures for the adoption of health and safety codes for various segments of industry where applicable; formation of a state administrative agency to administer and enforce laws, rules and regulations relating to health and safety of industrial employees; a procedure for the promulgation of rules and regulations under the legislation recommended which may apply to all industry or to a particular segment thereof; a procedure for court review of such administrative rules and regulations, and penalties for a failure of employers and employees to comply with such laws, rules and regulations.

Section 5. Each member of the commission shall receive the same per diem, mileage and expense allowances while attending and traveling to meetings as is provided in Section 9-13, Wyoming Statutes 1957, as amended, for officers and employees of the state.

Section 6. The commission shall make its final recommendations hereunder to the governor on or before November 15, 1968, and thereupon shall cease to exist.

Section 7. There is hereby appropriated out of any funds in the state treasury not otherwise appropriated, the sum of Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00), or so much thereof as may be necessary to carry out the provisions of the act.
