AN ACT to amend and re-enact Section 2-104,
Wyoming Compiled Statutes, 1945,
pertaining to the payment of fees to the
Board of Equalization by applicants to
the Board of State Law Examiners; and to
provide for Examinations and Certificates;
and to provide for an effective date for
this Act.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WYOMING:

Section 1. That Section 2-104, Wyoming Compiled Statutes, 1945, be amended and re-enacted to read as follows:

Section 2-104. Every applicant for admission to the bar of this State shall pay a fee of fifteen dollars (\$15.00) at the time of filing the application. On payment of one fee by applicants for admission with examination the applicant shall be entitled to two (2) examinations, but no more; the second being applied for not later than one year after having taken the first. The payment of the said fee shall also entitle the applicant, upon being admitted, to a certificate of admission. All sums of money received and collected under the provisions of this Act shall be payable to the State Board of Equalization and deposited by the said Board of Equalization in a bank approved by the State Board of Deposits, and after collections have cleared through said board, the same, except any bond deposits and the amount of refunds made, shall be transferred to the State Treasurer, who shall place the same to the credit of the State Board of Law Examiners' fund.

Section 2. This Act shall take effect and be in force from and after July 1, 1957.

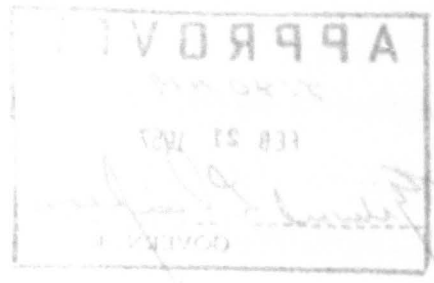

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WYOMING:
I hereby certify that this Act originated in the House.

Section 1. The Section 2-104, Wyoming Compiled Statutes, 1977, be amended and re-enacted to read as follows:
Section 2-104. Every applicant for admission to the bar of this state shall pay a fee of fifteen dollars (\$15.00) at the time of filing the application. On payment of one hundred dollars and admission with examination the applicant shall be admitted to the (2) examination, but no money shall be refunded for the examination fee.

not later than one year after having taken the first. The payment of one hundred dollars shall be made by the applicant, upon being admitted, to a certificate of admission. All sums of money received and retained under the provisions of this Act shall be payable to the State Board of Equalization and deposited in the State Board of Equalization in a bank approved by the State Board of Deposits, and after collection of such sums shall be turned over to the State Board, the same, except any bond deposits and the amount of refunds made, shall be transferred to the State Treasurer, who shall place the same to the credit of the State Board of Law Examiners' Fund. Section 2. This Act shall take effect and be in force from and after July 1, 1987.
