The 14 administration, management and control of said department is hereby 15 vested in a board which shall be known as the state police board and 16 shall consist of four (4) members, not more than two (2) of whom 17 shall belong to the same political party. All members of said board 18 shall be appointed by the governor for staggered terms of four (4) years each, 19 except when appointed to fill vacancies for unexpired terms. All 20 members appointed to said board shall serve during their respective 21 terms and until their respective successors have been appointed and 22 qualified. Any member of said board may be removed by the governor 23 for inefficiency, incompetency or neglect of duty after he has been 24 accorded a hearing by the governor upon reasonable notice of the 25 charge being made against him. 26 ( As compensation for his service, each member of the board shall 27 be entitled to receive the sum of twenty dollars (\$20.00) per day 28 for each and every day or fraction thereof during which he is engaged 29 in transacting the business of the board, and, in addition thereto, 30 his actual traveling and other expenses necessarily incurred in 31 discharging the duties of his office. As soon as practicable after 32 the members of the board shall have been appointed, they shall meet, 33 upon the call of the governor, and shall organize by the election of 34 a president and a secretary from among their own membership, each of 35 whom shall serve for a term of one (1) year. Three (3) members of

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- 1 the board shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business.
- 2. The board shall hold such regular monthly meetings and such special
- 3 meetings throughout the year as may be deemed necessary to transact
- 4 the business of the department. The governor, by and with the approval
- of the board, shall appoint a superintendent of the state police, who
- 6 shall be the executive officer and who shall have general charge of the
- 7 work of the department. The superintendent shall serve at the pleasure
- 8 of the governor, and the salary of the superintendent shall be fixed by
- 9 the governor, to be paid by the month, and the superintendent shall be
- 10 removable by the governor with or without cause. The state police
- 11 department shall be organized in conformity with such rules and regulations
- 12 as shall be prescribed and adopted, from time to time, by the board. The
- 13 superintendent shall be selected on the basis of training and experience,
- 14 and shall have served at least five (5) years as a police executive,
- or have had five (5) years' experience in the management of military,
- 16 semi-military or police bodies of men, to equip him for the position and
- 17 shall possess training in police affairs or public administration. All
- 18 personal property, supplies, services and equipment which may be needed
- 19 from time to time by the department shall be leased or purchased by the
- 20 state purchasing agent or his successor; all capital expenditures shall
- 21 be made with the approval of the budget committee, and the salaries and
- 22 compensation of the several police employees and other employees shall
- 23 be fixed by the board, with the approval of the personnel commission and
- 24 the governor.
- 25 Section 2. Definitions as used in this Act:
- 26 (1) The term "department" means the Wyoming state police
- 27 department created by this Act;
- 28 (2) The term "employee" means any employee of the department,
- 29 including police employees;
- 30 (3) The term "police employee" means any employee who is
- 31 assigned police work as a peace officer, pursuant to the provisions
- 32 of Section 10 of this Act;
- 33 (4) The term "civilian employee" means any employee assigned to a
- 34 position other than one having police rank as a peace officer; and

- (5) The term "board" means the state police board.
- 2 Section 3(A) The superintendent, with the approval of the board,
- 3 shall have authority to formulate and adopt and put into effect
- 4 such rules and regulations for the government of the department as,
- 5 from time to time, seem fit to him. He shall, with the approval
- 6 of the board, establish a classification of ranks and grades and
- 7 positions in the department, and for each rank, grade and position
- 8 he shall designate the authority and responsibility within the limits
- 9 of this Act. For each such rank, grade and position so established,
- 10 the superintendent shall set standards of qualifications, in
- 11 conformity with the most approved plans and standards adopted in
- 12 other states, and he shall fix the prerequisites of training,
- 13 education and experience; and the board shall, with the approval
- 14 of the personnel commission, prescribe the salaries to be paid.
- 15 (  $\wp$  ) The superintendent with the approval of the board shall, from
- 16 time to time, in accordance with the rules and regulations promulgated
- 17 by him, designate the rank, grade and position, to be held by each
- 18 employee of the department, until such person shall be by him
- 19 designated to hold another rank, grade or position. He shall have
- 20 authority to assign and reassign each employee of the department to
- 21 serve at such stations, and within the limits of this Act to perform
- 22 such duties as he shall designate. He shall have the authority to
- 23 determine the conditions and amounts of bonds to be required in
- 24 appropriate (ases.
- 25 Section 4. The superintendent shall, with the approval of the
- 26 board and within the limits of any appropriation made available for
- 27 such purpose, and subject only to provisions of Section 5 hereof
- 28 appoint such personnel to the ranks, grades and positions of the
- 29 department as are deemed by him to be necessary for the efficient
- 30 administration of the department. Appointment, insofar as is
- 31 consistent with the satisfaction of prescribed standards and pre-
- 32 requisites, small be made to the ranks, grades and positions of the
- 33 department vi:hout reference or regard to political affiliation.

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- 1 No person discharged from the department or withdrawing before the
- 2 completion of a two (2) year period of appointment shall afterwards be
- 3 eligible for reappointment. The superintendent shall devise and administer
- 4 examinations designed to test applicants in the qualifications required
- 5 for the rank, grade or position, and only those applicants shall be
- 6 appointed who best meet the prescribed standards and prerequisites.
- 7 All employees appointed to the department shall be probationers and
- 8 on probation for a period of one (1) year from the date of appointment;
- 9 Provided, that the board may extend such probationary status, for cause,
- 10 for any period not exceeding one (1) additional year.
- 11 (A) Any prospective employee of the department, otherwise qualified,
- 12 shall not be disqualified from such employment solely for the reason
- 13 of his previous resignation from the Wyoming highway patrol.
- 14 ( @ ) Whoever being an appointee or an employee of the department,
- 15 including the superintendent, participates in any manner in the
- 16 activities or interests of any political party or of any candidate
- 17 for public office or for the nomination therefor, or participates
- 18 in any manner in any political campaign for the nomination or election
- 19 of candidates for public office, in violation of any state or federal
- 20 laws regarding political activities of public employees, shall be guilty
- 21 of a misdemeanor and shall be fined in a sum not more than five hundred
- 22 dollars (\$500.00) to which may be added imprisonment for a period not
- 23 to exceed six (6) months.
- 24 ( ( ) Whoever solicits or accepts from any person who is an appointee or
- 25 employee of the department, including the superintendent, any money, property
- 26 or thing of value as a contribution or gift to be used in support of any
- 27 political campaign, political party, candidate for public office or for
- 28 the nomination therefor, or for any political purpose, shall be deemed
- 29 guilty of a misdemeanor and shall upon conviction be fined in a sum of
- 30 not more than five hundred dollars (\$500.00) to which may be
- 31 added imprisonment for a period of not to exceed six (6) months.

- Section 5. The superintendent, with the approval of the board,
- 2 is authorized and hereby directed to organize and maintain a training
- 3 school or academy for police employees of the department. No police
- 4 employee shall be assigned to regular active duty until he shall
- 5 have received training and successfully passed the course for pro-
- 6 bationers prescribed by the superintendent. Training courses, other than
- 7 for the probationers, shall be prescribed and conducted by the
- 8 superintendent for all police employees of the department.
- 9 Section 6. The superintendent may discharge, demote or
- 10 temporarily suspend any employee of the department, for cause,
- 11 after preferring charges in writing. Such charges may be based
- 12 on any violation of the laws of the state of Wyoming or any
- 13 violation of the regulations of the department which have been
- 14 approved by the board. A copy of such charges shall be personally
- 15 delivered to the employee so charged by his immediate commanding
- 16 officer. Any employee so charged shall have a right to answer such
- 17 charges in a personal appearance before the superintendent and said
- 18 appearance shall be set by the superintendent not less than five (5)
- 19 days after the delivery of the copy of the written charges to such
- 20 employee. Pursuant to such charges and after such personal appear-
- 21 ance, disciplinary action taken by the superintendent shall be subject
- 22 to review at a public hearing before the board if such hearing is
- 23 demanded by the disciplined employee within fifteen (15) days after
- 24 receiving notice of such disciplinary action. Such notice shall be
- 25 by certified mail, return receipt requested, and shall be addressed
- 26 to the employee at his last known place of residence. If any such
- 27 employee fails to request a hearing before the board within fifteen
- 28 (15) days after receiving notice of disciplinary action, as herein
- 29 provided, the decision and action of the superintendent shall be
- 30 final and not subject to review.
- 31 (1) Any employee who requests a hearing before the board as herein
- 32 provided may be represented by counsel. The attorney general shall
- 33 appear in all such cases representing the interests of the people of
- 34 the state of Wyoming and the state shall carry the burden of proving
- 35 any charges giving rise to such hearing. The procedure in all

- 1 hearings before the board shall be informal and without recourse to
- 2 the technical common law rules of evidence required in proceedings in
- 3 judicial courts. The board shall designate a reporter for said
- 4 hearing and after all evidence has been introduced the board shall
- 5 make an informal finding of facts and a determination based upon
- 6 said facts.
- 7 (d) The board shall notify the employee of its findings and
- 8 determination by certified mail, return receipt requested, addressed
- 9 to the employee at his last known place of residence and any employee
- 10 aggrieved by such determination may seek administrative and judicial
- 11 review by following the applicable provisions of the Wyoming
- 12 administrative procedures Act.
- 13 ( ) Probationers may be discharged, demoted or temporarily suspended
- 14 without right to a hearing before the board.
- 15 ( No employee shall be discharged, demoted, temporarily suspended
- 16 or disciplined because of political affiliation, nor shall any such
- 17 action be carried out after his probationary period, except as
- 18 provided in this Act.
- 19 (g) Nothing in this Act shall be construed so as to prevent the
- 20 exercise of disciplinary measures by commanding officers within the
- 21 department pursuant to the regulations approved by the board.
- 22 Section 7. The police board shall provide for the employees of
- 23 the department within the amount of appropriations therefor, the
- 24 uniforms and equipment necessary to the performance of their respective.
- 25 duties, but all such uniforms and equipment shall remain the property
- 26 of the state. The board shall have the authority to sell such
- 27 uniforms and equipment with the consent of the governor as they shall
- 28 become unfit for use, and all moneys received therefor shall be paid
- 29 into the state treasury as a special fund to be used to purchase of new
- 30 equipment. The board shall pharge against any employee of the department the
- 31 value of any property of the department lost or destroyed through
- 32 carelessness or neglect of such employee, and if it shall be determined
- 33 by the board that such loss or destruction was due to carelessness or
- 34 neglect, then the value of such equipment shall be deducted from the
- 35 pay of such employee.

Section 8. The superintendent shall have the authority to approve 1 youchers in payment of expenses incurred by employees of the department 2 in the discharge of their duties, and such vouchers shall be audited 3 and paid out of the appropriations for the department in the manner 4 provided by law. Allowances for lodging and subsistence while away 5 from official station may be paid to the employees of the department under such terms and conditions as the superintendent may prescribe. Section 9. The superintendent shall, with the cooperation of the 8 Wyoming highway commission, establish headquarters, offices, laboratories 9 and stations in such localities as he shall deem advisable for the 10 enforcement of the laws of the state, and to that end, and within the 11 limits of appropriations, he may purchase, lease or otherwise acquire 12 suitable places, lands, buildings or rooms as local headquarters, and 13 erect and equip such buildings and headquarters as may be necessary. 14 He may also purchase or otherwise acquire motor equipment, horses, and 15 other services, commodities and equipment deemed by him essential for the 16 needs of the employees of the department in carrying out their duties. 17 Maintenance, servicing, repair and storage of spare vehicles may be 18 accomplished in the shops, garages and facilities of the Wyoming highway commission wherever possible, under contractual arrangements by the commission 20 and the board. The superintendent may, in his discretion, discontinue any 21 headquarters or stations, when such action seems to him to be desirable for 22 the proper enforcement of the laws of the state. The superintendent shall 23 also have the authority to purchase, install or contract for any approved 24 standard mechanical devices or equipment or services for the instantaneous 25 or rapid transmission or broadcasting of any information relative to crime 26 or the apprehension of criminals. The superintendent, with the approval of 27 the board, shall have the authority to sell, dispose of or destroy such 28 property as shall have become unnecessary or unfit for further use by the 29 department. Any money or funds received from such sale shall be deposited 30 in the state treasury as a special fund to be used for the purchase of new 31 equipment. Such fund shall not revert to the general fund. Such authority as 32 is vested in the superintendent in this Section of this Act shall be 33 exercised with the approval of the board. 34 Section 10. $^{(l)}$ The officers and police employees of the department are 35 hereby vested with all necessary police powers to enforce the provisions

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of the traffic laws of the state of Wyoming for the regulation and use of
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     automobiles, motor vehicles and other vehicles, and the laws for the
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     safeguarding and protection of the surface or other physical portion of
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     the highways of the state of Wyoming and without writ of warrant for
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     violation thereof when committed in their presence; Provided, however,
     that nothing herein shall be construed to prevent the Wyoming highway
     commission from adopting rules and regulations for the safeguarding of travel
     on the state highways of the state, not inconsistent with the laws of this
            It shall also be the duty of police employees of the department to
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     prevent and detect crime, to apprehend criminals, to enforce the criminal
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     and traffic laws of the state, and to perform such other related duties as
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     may be imposed upon them by the laws of the state, and to this end, police
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     employees of the department shall be peace officers and shall have in any
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     part of the state the same powers with respect to criminal matters and the
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     enforcement of the laws relating thereto as sheriffs and police officers
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     have in their respective jurisdictions, and shall have power and authority
     to act as agents for the state of Wyoming on return of parolees, fugitives
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     from justice and persons extradited to Wyoming for crime. The costs and
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     expenses of extradition proceedings shall be borne by the office of the
     Wyoming attorney general. Any warrant of arrest or search warrant issued
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     by proper authority of the state may be executed by any police employee of
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     the department in any part of the state, according to its terms, without
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     endorsement. They shall be subject to the call of the governor, and the
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     governor may, from time to time, assign to the department such other
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     police duties as the executive department may deem advisable or necessary.
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     They shall have full power to arrest without warrant any person committing
     or attempting to commit in their presence or view a breach of peace or any
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     other violation of any of the laws of the state of Wyoming. And, under order
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     of the superintendent, they are empowered to cooperate with any other
     department of the state of Wyoming or with local authorities. They
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     shall not exercise their powers within the limits of any city in
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     labor disputes, nor to suppress rioting and disorder except by
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     direction of the governor, or upon the request of the mayor of any
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such city with the approval of the governor or if the governor is

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not available, with the approval of the attorney general of the state
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     of Wyoming. And without the limits of any city of the state they shall not
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     exercise their power and authority in labor disputes except by direction of
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     the governor, or the request of the judge of the district court of the
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     county with the approval of the governor or if the governor is not available,
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     with the approval of the attorney general. The control or direction of the
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     officers or members of the department hereby created shall not be trans-
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     ferred or delegated to any other department, commission, agency or officer
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     of the state or any subdivision hereof.
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          Section 11. There is hereby created and established within the depart-
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     ment a separate bureau, which shall be known as the bureau of criminal identi-
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     fication and investigation. No funds for the operation and administration of
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     this bureau shall be received from the highway user receipts in violation of
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     Article 15, Section 16, of the Constitution of the State of Wyoming.
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     ( ) The bureau of criminal identification and investigation shall be
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     under the immediate charge and supervision of an officer who shall be known
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     as the director thereof and who shall work closely with and coordinate his
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     efforts with the superintendent of state police. The director shall be a
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     person who is well qualified to discharge the duties which are devolved upon
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     him by the provisions of this Act, who at the time of appointment shall have
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     had at least five (5) years' experience as a police officer and can qualify
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     as to classifying Bertillon measurements and fingerprints, and shall be
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     appointed by the superintendent of state police, by and with approval of the
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     board. The superintendent of state police, shall appoint such clerks, steno-
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     graphers and other employees as may be necessary to discharge the duties and
     perform the work of the bureau. The director shall give bond in the sum of
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     five thousand dollars ($5,000.00) for the faithful performance of
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     his duties. The salary of the director shall be fixed by the board.
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     The salaries of the clerks, stenographers and other employees shall
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     be fixed in said bureau as those of other employees of the department.
30
          Section 12. It shall be the duty of the bureau of criminal
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     identification and investigation to install and maintain complete
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     systems for the identification of criminals, including the finger-
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print system and the modus operandi system. The bureau shall obtain

from whatever source procurable, and shall file and preserve for

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- 1 record, such plates, photographs, outline pictures, fingerprints,
- 2 measurements, descriptions, modus operandi statements and such other
- 3 information about, concerning or relating to any and all persons who
- 4 have been or who shall hereafter be convicted of a felony or who
- 5 shall attempt to commit a felony within this state, or who are well
- 6 known and habitual criminals, or who have been convicted of any of the
- 7 following felonies or misdemeanors: illegally carrying, concealing
- 8 or possessing a pistol or any other dangerous weapon; buying or
- 9 receiving stolen property; unlawful entry of a building; escaping
- 10 or aiding an escape from prison; making or possessing a fraudulent
- 11 or forged check or draft; petit larceny; and unlawfully possessing
- 12 or distributing narcotic drugs or other controlled substances under
- 13 Wyoming laws. The bureau may also obtain like information concerning

- 18 a felony. The bureau shall make a complete and systematic record

- 25 of any information relative to crime or the apprehension of criminals.
- 26 The superintendent, with the approval of the board, shall have the
- 27 authority to sell, dispose of or destory such property as shall have
- 28 become unnecessary or unfit for further use by the department. Any
- 29 money or funds received from such sale shall be deposited in the state
- 30 treasury as a special fund to be used for the purchase of new equipment.
- 31 Said fund shall not revert to the general fund. Such authority as is
- 32 vested in the superintendent in this Section of this Act shall be
- 33 exercised with the approval of the board.
- 34 Section 10. The officers and police employees of the department are
- 35 hereby vested with all necessary police powers to enforce the provisions

of the laws of the state of Wyoming for the regulation and use of automobiles, motor vehicles and other vehicles, and the laws for the safeguarding and protection of the surface or other physical portion of the highways of the state of Wyoming and without writ of warrant for violation thereof when committed in their presence: Provided, however, that nothing herein shall be construed to prevent the Wyoming highway commission from adopting rules and regulations for the safeguarding of travel on the state highways of the state, not inconsistent with the laws of this state. It shall also be the duty of police employees of the department to prevent and detect crime, to 10 apprehend criminals, to enforce the criminal and traffic laws of the 11 state, and to perform such other related duties as may be imposed upon 12 them by the laws of the state, and to this end, police employees of 14 the department shall be peace officers and shall have in any part of the state the same powers with respect to criminal matters and the 15 enforcement of the laws relating thereto as sheriffs and police officers 16 have in their respective jurisdictions, and shall have power and 17 authority to act as agents for the state of Wyoming on return of 18 parolees, fugitives from justice and persons extradited to Wyoming for crime. Any warrant of arrest or search warrant issued by proper 20 authority of the state may be executed by any police employee of the 21 department in any part of the state, according to the tenor thereof, 22 without indorsement. They shall be subject to the call of the 23 governor, and the governor may, from time to time, assign to the 24 25 department such other police duties as the executive department may deem advisable or necessary. They shall have full power to arrest 26 without warrant any person committing or attempting to commit in 27 their presence or view a breach of peace or any other violation of 28 any of the laws of the state of Wyoming. And, under order of the 29 30 superintendent, they are empowered to cooperate with any other department of the state of Wyoming or with local authorities. They 31 shall not exercise their powers within the limits of any city in 32 labor disputes, nor to suppress rioting and disorder except by 33 direction of the governor, or upon the request of the mayor of any 34

35 such city with the approval of the governor or if the governor is

- 1 not available, with the approval of the secretary of state. And
- 2 without the limits of any city of the state they shall not exercise
- 3 their power and authority in labor disputes except by direction of
- 4 the governor, or the request of the judge of the district court of
- 5 the county with the approval of the governor or if the governor is
- 6 not available, with the approval of the secretary of state. The
- 7 control or direction of the officers or members of the department
- 8 hereby created shall not be transferred or delegated to any other
- 9 department, commission, agency or officer of the state or any
- 10 subdivision hereof.
- 11 Section 11. There is hereby created and established within
- 12 the department a bureau, which shall be known as the bureau of
- 13 criminal identification and investigation.
- 14 The bureau of criminal identification and investigation shall
- 15 be under the immediate charge and supervision of an officer who
- 16 shall be known as the director thereof and who shall work closely
- 17 with and coordinate his efforts with the superintendent of state
- 18 police. The director shall be a person who is well qualified to
- 19 discharge the duties which are devolved upon him by the provisions
- 20 of this Act, who at the time of appointment shall have had at
- 21 least five (5) years' experience as a police officer and can qualify
- 22 as to classifying bertillon measurements and fingerprints, and shall
- 23 be appointed by the superintendent of state police. The superintendent
- 24 of state police, shall appoint such clerks, stenographers and other
- 25 employees as may be necessary to discharge the duties and perform
- 26 the work of the bureau. The director shall give bond in the sum of
- 27 five thousand dollars (\$5,000.00) for the faithful performance of
- 28 his duties. The salary of the director shall be fixed by the board.
- 29 The salaries of the clerks, stenographers and other employees shall
- 30 be fixed in said bureau as those of other employees of the department.
- 31 Section 12. It shall be the duty of the bureau of criminal
- 32 identification and investigation to install and maintain complete
- 33 systems for the identification of criminals, including the finger-
- 34 print system and the modus operandi system. The bureau shall obtain
- 35 from whatever source procurable, and shall file and preserve for

- 1 and regulations from time to time as may be found necessary and
- 2 proper for the efficient operation of the bureau and the successful
- 3 administration of the provisions of this Act.
- 4 Section 20. The members of the department shall have the
- 5 authority and duty to take fingerprints, and such other identification
- 6 data as shall be prescribed by the superintendent of all persons
- 7 taken into custody for offenses other than those arising solely out
- 8 of violations of fish, game, conservation, traffic laws, or misde-
- 9 meanors but such members of the department shall have the authority,
- 10 if they deem it advisable, to take the fingerprints and such other
- 11 identification data as shall be prescribed by the superintendent, of
- 12 all persons taken into custody for offenses arising out of violations
- 13 of fish, game, conservation, traffic laws or misdemeanors and it shall
- 14 be their duty promptly to transmit and file such fingerprints and
- 15 other identification data as the superintendent may prescribe.
- Section 21. The employees of the department shall cooperate and
- 17 exchange information with any other department or authority of the
- 18 state or with other police forces, both within this state and outside
- 19 it, and with federal police forces, toward the end of achieving
- 20 greater success in preventing and detecting crimes and apprehending
- 21 criminals.
- 22 Section 22. Any person having charge of a jail, prison or
- 23 reformatory or other place of detention shall receive any prisoner
- 24 arrested by a police employee of the department within the jurisdiction
- 25 served by such jail, and shall detain him in custody until otherwise
- 26 ordered by a court of competent jurisdiction, or by the superintendent;
- 27 and such person who shall refuse to so receive any prisoner or who,
- 28 having received him, shall release him otherwise than as above specified,
- 29 shall be subject to removal from office.
- 30 Section 23. The unexpended balance of all appropriations made
- 31 for the Wyoming highway patrol and the state bureau of identification
- 32 is continued in force and hereby confirmed and assigned to the state
- 33 police department created by this Act. Upon the taking effect of this
- 34 Act, all records, papers, files, property, equipment and pending
- 35 matters or business are hereby transferred to and shall become the

- 1 property of the state police department created by this Act. Nothing
- 2 contained in this Act shall be construed to affect pending litigation
- 3 growing out of, connected with, or had under or pursuant to any law
- 4 or former law relating to or enforced by the state police department
- 5 heretofore existing or any officer thereof, but the same shall proceed
- by or against the state police department created hereby, or its corres-
- 7 ponding officer, as if this Act had not been passed. All references
- 8 in the Wyoming Statutes relating to the Wyoming highway patrol shall,
- 9 after the passage of this Act, be construed to refer to and be
- 10 applicable solely to the newly created Wyoming state police department,
- 11 as set out herein.
- 12 Section 24. All the rights, duties and liabilities of the state
- 13 police department and its employees, including pension, insurance and
- 14 retirement plans, are hereby continued and preserved in the state
- 15 police department created by this Act and those eligible to its
- 16 benefits, as though this Act had not been passed.
- 17 Section 25. That Section 31-7, Wyoming Statutes 1957, Compiled
- 18 1967; Section 31-8, Wyoming Statutes 1957, Compiled 1967; Section 31-9,
- 19 Wyoming Statutes 1957, Compiled 1967; Section 31-10, Wyoming Statutes
- 20 1957, Compiled 1967; Section 31-11, Wyoming Statutes 1957, Compiled
- 21 1967, as amended and re-enacted by Sections 1 and 2 of Chapter 186,
- 22 Session Laws of Wyoming 1969; and Chapter 61, Session Laws of Wyoming
- 23 1963, are hereby repealed.
- Section 26. This Act shall become effective on and after July 1,
- 25 1971.
