

## CHAPTER 33.

House Bill No. 85.

### LAND—SELECTION, LEASING, AND CONTROL.

An Act to amend and re-enact Sections 7 and 10 of an Act entitled "An Act concerning public lands of the State of Wyoming, providing for the selection, care, leasing and control of the same, and designating and defining the duties of officers in the selection, management and control of such lands," approved January 10, 1891.

*Be it Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:*

Section 1. That Sections 7 and 10 of an Act entitled "An Act concerning public lands of the State of Wyoming, providing for the selection, care, leasing and control of the same, and designating and defining the duties of officers in the selection, management and control of such lands," approved January 10, 1891, be and the same are hereby amended and re-enacted so as to read as follows:

Register

Sec 7. The Superintendent of Public Instruction shall be Secretary of the Board and shall be known as "The Register of the Board of Land Commissioners," and shall keep the records of the Board, make out and countersign all patents and leases issued by the Board to purchasers, and shall make out and countersign all leases of State lands, and he shall also record said leases, patents and certificates of purchase in books kept for the purpose.

Duties of

He shall file and preserve the bonds or leases, thus given by purchasers to secure deferred payments.

He shall make out and deliver to purchasers suitable certificates of purchase. He shall have the custody of the seal of the Board.

He shall keep the minutes of the Board, and shall perform such other duties concerning the land affairs of the State as the Board may direct.

Fees

Sec. 10. The Board shall collect the following fees:

For filing each application to lease or purchase, one dollar.

For making duplicate leases, each one dollar.

For duplicate certificates of purchase, each two dollars.

For issuing more than one certificate on each purchase of State lands made by one party, two dollars for each additional certificate so issued.

For making certified copies of papers or records,

the same fees as provided for to be charged by the Secretary of State for like services.

Sec. 2. This Act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
