AN ACT to create W.S. 9-1-634 and 39-1-103 through 39-1-105; and to amend W.S. 36-10-101 relating to the acquisition or control of state or private lands by the federal government; directing the attorney general to review any acquisition or control of state or private lands in Wyoming by any federal agency and to report findings and recommended action to the governor; authorizing the governor to take appropriate action; declaring protection of state and private lands in Wyoming from federal regulation or acquisition to be in the state's interest; requiring consent of the legislature to acquisition of real property or water rights by the United States; providing conditions for granting legislative consent; requiring payments in lieu of taxes for property acquired by the United States; and providing for an effective date.

#### A BILL

for

1 AN ACT to create W.S. 9-1-634 and 39-1-103 through 39-1-105; and to amend W.S. 36-10-101 relating to the 2 acquisition or control of state or private lands by the 3 federal government; directing the attorney general to 4 5 review any acquisition or control of state or private lands in Wyoming by any federal agency and to report find-6 7 ings and recommended action to the governor; authorizing 8 the governor to take appropriate action; declaring pro-9 tection of state and private lands in Wyoming from federal regulation or acquisition to be in the state's interest; 10 requiring consent of the legislature to acquisition of 11

- 1 real property or water rights by the United States; pro-
- 2 viding conditions for granting legislative consent;
- 3 requiring payments in lieu of taxes for property acquired
- 4 by the United States; and providing for an effective date.
- 5 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:
- 6 Section 1. W.S. 9-1-634 and 39-1-103 through
- 7 39-1-105 are created to read:
- 8 9-1-634. Attorney general to review land acquisition
- 9 or control by federal government; action to protect state
- 10 interests.
- 11 (a) The legislature finds it is in the state's
- 12 public interest to preserve and protect the land and human
- 13 resources in this state from federal encroachment. Acqui-
- 14 sition of state and private lands by the federal govern-
- ment diminishes the tax base of the state and deprives its
- 16 citizens of the right to own and use the land resources of
- 17 the state to enhance the state economy. It is in the
- 18 interests of the state and its citizens that the land
- 19 resources in the state be protected from regulation or
- 20 acquisition by the federal government.
- 21 (b) The attorney general shall promptly review any
- 22 reported acquisition or threatened acquisition of state or

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private property in Wyoming, or any reported regulation or 1 2 attempt to regulate the use and enjoyment of state or private property in Wyoming by any agency of the federal 3 4 government. The attorney general shall determine the legal authority for the asserted acquisition or control, 5 and shall report any findings and make recommendations to 6 7 the governor for appropriate action. The governor may 8 authorize the attorney general to take such action as 9 deems appropriate to protect the interests of the state and its citizens against land acquisitions or controls by 10 the federal government and its agencies. The governor 11 shall report to the legislature any proposed transfer to 12 13 or imposition of jurisdiction by the federal government of 14 state or private property.

39-1-103. Consent may be given for transfer of jurisdiction to the United States. Consent of the state of Wyoming to acquisition by the United States of America of any land or water right or interest therein in this state, except voluntary conveyances of privately owned property or property rights, desired for any purpose expressly stated in Clause 17, Section 8, Article I of the Constitution of the United States may be given only after approval by the legislature of the state of Wyoming, upon finding that the proposed transfer of jurisdiction and the method

- 1 thereof and all other matters pertaining thereto are con-
- 2 sistent with the best interest of the state and conform to
- 3 the provisions of the United States Constitution and fed-
- 4 eral laws.

#### 5 <u>39-1-104.</u> Same; with certain rights reserved.

- Consent of the state of Wyoming may also be 6 7 given only after approval by the legislature of the state 8 of Wyoming in cases where privately owned or state-owned 9 real property is desired by the United States for other than those purposes expressly stated in Clause 17, Section 10 8. Article I of the Constitution of the United States, 11 when the legislature finds that such proposed transfer of 12 13 jurisdiction and method thereof and all other matters 14 pertaining thereto are consistent with the best interest of the state and conform to provisions of federal laws. 15
- (b) Consent of the state shall be required for all acquisitions of real property or of rights therein, including water rights, of any nature whatever, by the United States or any agency thereof, except voluntary conveyances of privately owned property or property rights.

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#### acquisition.

- 2 (a) The consent of the state in all such cases shall
- 3 be conditioned upon the following requirements having been
- 4 complied with and such other factors as the legislature
- 5 may deem appropriate:
- 6 (i) The United States shall agree by written
- 7 contract to make payments in lieu of taxes, upon the prop-
- 8 erty, including improvements thereon, at the rate that
- 9 other similar property, in the county is taxed. Payments
- 10 shall continue as long as ownership by the United States
- of America continues. Such tax payments shall be appor-
- 12 tioned among the state, and the taxing agencies and polit-
- ical subdivisions which would otherwise have the right to
- 14 tax the property if the property were privately owned.
- 15 The contract and all deeds and documents evidencing the
- 16 conveyance of title to the United States or any agency
- 17 thereof shall provide that title to the property and all
- 18 rights appurtenant thereto shall revert to the grantor, or
- 19 to the grantors heirs, if any, or if there are no heirs
- 20 then to the state of Wyoming, if the payments in lieu of
- 21 taxes are not paid.
- 22 (ii) The Wyoming tax commission shall be the
- 23 sole bargaining agency between the state, its political

- 1 subdivisions and the federal government, and shall
- 2 determine the ratio of distribution of payments in lieu of
- 3 taxes required to be paid by the federal government. No
- 4 in lieu of tax payments shall be demanded under these
- 5 provisions for a right-of-way for a public road or post
- office, or for any purpose expressly stated in Clause 17,
- 7 Section 8, Article I of the Constitution of the United
- 8 States.
- 9 Section 2. W.S. 36-10-101 is amended to read:
- 10 <u>36-10-101</u>. Authority to acquire state lands; reser-
- 11 vation of mineral rights.
- 12 (a) The United States shall be and is authorized to
- 13 acquire by purchase, ex condemnation or otherwise, any
- 14 land in this state required for public buildings, custom
- 15 houses, arsenals, national cemeteries, or other purposes
- 16 essential to the national defense in FOR necessary use of
- 17 said THE land by armed naval, air or land forces, or land
- 18 to be physically occupied by the Boysen Dam, its reser-
- 19 voir, power plant and distribution systems, or lands to be
- 20 physically occupied by dams, reservoirs, power plants and
- 21 distribution systems in United States reclamation service
- 22 projects, and the state of Wyoming hereby consents
- 23 thereto, provided that the mineral content of lands so

- 1 acquired, if owners thereof so elect, shall be reserved to
- 2 such THE owners.
- 3 (b) LAND WHICH IS BEING CONSIDERED FOR ACQUISITION
- 4 BY THE UNITED STATES FOR ANY OTHER PURPOSE, WHETHER BY FEE
- 5 OR EASEMENT, MAY BE ACQUIRED ONLY AFTER APPROVAL BY THE
- 6 LEGISLATURE UNLESS THE ACQUISITION IS MADE BY A VOLUNTARY
- 7 CONVEYANCE OF PRIVATELY OWNED LAND.
- 8 Section 3. This act is effective May 27, 1983.
