REMOVAL AND MAINTENANCE OF PRISONERS SENTENCED TO CONFINEMENT IN PENITENTIARY.

AN ACT to amend and re-enact Section 579 of Chapter 46, Wyoming Compiled Statutes, 1920, relating to Prisoners.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

Section 1. That Section 579 of the Wyoming Compiled Statutes of 1920 be and the same is hereby amended and re-enacted to read as follows:

Maintenance and Removal of Prisoners.—Clerk to Notify Board Expense of Transportation.

Section 579. All prisoners sentenced to confinement in any penitentiary shall be maintained at the County Jails after sentence at the expense of the State until removed to the Penitentiary; compensation therefor to be paid at the rate allowed the sheriffs by law for keeping prisoners. Prisoners shall be removed to the penitentiary within ten days after sentence and it shall be the duty of the clerk of court, immediately after sentence is pronounced, to notify the State Board of Charities and Reform of such sentence. When more than two prisoners are to be transferred to the penitentiary at the same time, and the sheriff finds it necessary to employ extra guards to aid in transporting such prisoners, the expense per diem of such guards shall be paid by the County. But the actual and necessary traveling expenses incurred by the Sheriff or extra guards in transporting prisoners from the county jail to the penitentiary shall be paid by the State.

Section 2. All Acts and parts of Acts in conflict with this Act are hereby repealed.

Section 3. This Act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
