

CHAPTER 144.

Original House Bill No. 229.

APPROPRIATION—NEBRASKA VS. WYOMING—SUIT.

AN ACT appropriating money for the defense of the suit instituted by the State of Nebraska vs. the State of Wyoming in the Supreme Court of the United States and concerning the waters of the North Platte River; authorizing the use in defense of said suit of the unexpended balance of the monies appropriated for such purpose in Chapter 90, Session Laws of Wyoming, 1935; and providing for the control of expenditures by the Governor of the State of Wyoming.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

Section 1. There is hereby appropriated and made available for the Governor of the State of Wyoming, for use during the two years ending March 31, 1939, from the General Fund of the State of Wyoming, the sum of Fifty Thousand (\$50,000.00) Dollars (approved for **Thirty-five Thousand Dollars (\$35,000.00)**), or so much thereof as is necessary, for use in defense of the suit filed by the State of Nebraska vs. the State of Wyoming in the Supreme Court of the United States and concerning the waters of the North Platte River.

Section 2. The Governor of the State of Wyoming is authorized to use in defense of the said suit, during the two years ending March 31, 1939, the unexpended balance, or so much thereof as is necessary, of the appropriation in the sum of Fifty-five Thousand (\$55,000.00) Dollars, authorized in Chapter 90, Session Laws of Wyoming, 1935.

Section 3. Monies so appropriated shall be controlled by the Governor of the State of Wyoming and be disbursed by him in any manner deemed necessary in defense of this suit.

Section 4. This Act shall take effect and be in force from and after March 31, 1937.
