

for

1 AN ACT to create W.S. 6-183.2 relating to the civil and
2 criminal liability of medical personnel assisting peace
3 officers in the performance of duties; providing for
4 circumstances when medical personnel assisting peace offi-
5 cers are not criminally liable for their act; and provid-
6 ing for an effective date.

7 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

8 Section 1. W.S. 6-183.2 is created to read:

9 6-183.2. Limitations of civil and criminal liability
10 of medical personnel in assisting peace officers in the
11 performance of their duty.

12 (a) Any physician, surgeon, nurse, paramedic or
13 hospital technician, when directed by court order to take
14 a blood sample or urine sample or to perform any other
15 medical examination, not contrary to the health or dignity
16 of the person tested, and such sample test or examination

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1 is taken or administered in a proper fashion, is not
2 civilly liable to the person being so tested or examined.
3 No physician, surgeon, nurse, paramedic or hospital tech-
4 nician is criminally liable for the taking of any such
5 sample or performance of any such medical examination when
6 such is properly administered pursuant to court order.

7 Section 2. This act is effective immediately upon
8 completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become law
9 as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the Wyoming Con-
10 stitution.


