## ABILL

An Act to Amend and Re-enact Sections 1 and 4 of Chapter 5 of the Session Laws of 1896, entitled, "An Act fixing the compensation of the members and officers of the Legislature, and providing for the payment Thereof."

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WYOMING:

Section 1. That Section 1 of Chapter 5 of the Session Laws of 1895, entitled "An Act fixing the Compensation of the members and officers of the Legislature, and providing for the payment thereof", be amended and re-enacted so as to read as follows:

Section 1. Each member of the legislature shall receive five dollars a day for each day's attendance and for each day necessarily and actually spent in going to and returning from the seat of government in attendance upon the legislature, together with such amount as he shall have to necessarily and actually expend and pay out for transportation by the nearest practicable route, and shall have no other compensation or perquisite whatever.

section 2. That Section 4 of Chapter 5 of the Session Laws of 1896, entitled "An Act fixing the compensation of the members and
officers of the Legislature, and providing for the payment
thereof", be amended and re-enacted so as to read as follows:

Section 1. The chief clerk of each house shall issue to each presiding officer and to the officers and members of each house of the legislature, proper and sufficient certificates of attendance and service, which may be in-

cluded in certificates of attendance; and certificates for mileage of the members may be issued at any time after the qualification thereof, and certificates of attendance may be issued from the time of service of the member, whether for the full term or a fractional part thereof, said certificates to be approved by the presiding officer of his respective house.
