6 *Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:*

7

8 **Section 1.** W. S. 21-4-310 is created to read:

9

10 **21-4-310. Reporting of unlawful activity to law**
11 **enforcement by school personnel.**

13 (a) Any principal, teacher or other school employee
14 who has knowledge of any unlawful activity as defined in
15 subsection (c) of this section which occurred or may have
16 occurred on school property shall report such activity to
17 the superintendent of the school district or his designee
18 who shall notify the appropriate law enforcement officials

1 as required by this section. In the event of an emergency
2 or if the superintendent or his designee is unavailable, any
3 principal may make a report required under this subsection.
4

5 (b) When the superintendent or his designee has a
6 reasonable belief that an act has occurred on educational
7 property or during a school related activity involving any
8 of the offenses set forth in subsection (c) of this section,
9 the superintendent or his designee shall immediately report
10 the act to the appropriate local law enforcement agency.
11 For purposes of this subsection, "school property" shall
12 include any public school building, bus, public school
13 campus, grounds, recreational area or athletic field in the
14 charge of the superintendent. The state board of education
15 shall prescribe a form for making reports required under
16 this subsection.
17

18 (c) For purposes of this section, "unlawful activity"
19 means any of the following:
20

21 (i) Possession or use of a deadly weapon as
22 defined in W.S. 6-8-103;
23

24 (ii) Possession, sale or use of any controlled
25 substance;

2 (iii) Aggravated assault and battery as defined
3 in W.S. 6-2-502;

4

5 (iv) Simple assault as defined in W.S. 6-2-501,
6 upon any school employee;

7

8 (v) Sexual assault in either the first, second or
9 third degrees as defined by W.S. 6-2-302, 6-2-303 and
10 6-2-304;

11

12 (vi) Murder as defined by W.S. 6-2-101 and
13 6-2-104;

14

15 (vii) Kidnapping as defined by W.S. 6-2-201.

16

17 **Section 2.** This act is effective immediately upon
18 completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become law as
19 provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the Wyoming
20 Constitution.
